### Day 1: Choosing Faith in the Face of Fear

In the story of Caleb and Joshua, we see a powerful example of choosing faith over fear. When the twelve spies returned from exploring the Promised Land, only Caleb and Joshua believed that God would help them conquer it. Their faith was not based on the absence of challenges but on the presence of God's promise and power. This teaches us that faith is not the absence of fear but the decision to trust God despite it. In our lives, we often face situations that seem overwhelming, but like Caleb and Joshua, we are called to trust that God equips us for victory. By choosing faith, we align ourselves with God's promises and open ourselves to His transformative power.

Numbers 14:6-9 (ESV): "And Joshua the son of Nun and Caleb the son of Jephunneh, who were among those who had spied out the land, tore their clothes and said to all the congregation of the people of Israel, 'The land, which we

passed through to spy it out, is an exceedingly good land. If the Lord delights in us, he will bring us into this land and give it to us, a land that flows with milk and honey. Only do not rebel against the Lord. And do not fear the people of the land, for they are bread for us. Their protection is removed from them, and the Lord is with us; do not fear them.'"

Reflection: What is one fear you are currently facing that you can choose to trust God with today? How can you actively demonstrate your faith in this situation?

## **Day 2: Seeing Potential in God's Opportunities**

Caleb and Joshua's perspective on the Promised Land was vastly different from the other spies. While others saw giants and obstacles, they saw potential and opportunity. Isaiah 43:18-19 (ESV): "Remember not the former things, nor consider the things of old. Behold, I am doing a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert."

Reflection: Think of a current challenge in your life. How might God be using this situation as an opportunity for growth or transformation? What steps can you take to embrace this opportunity today?
